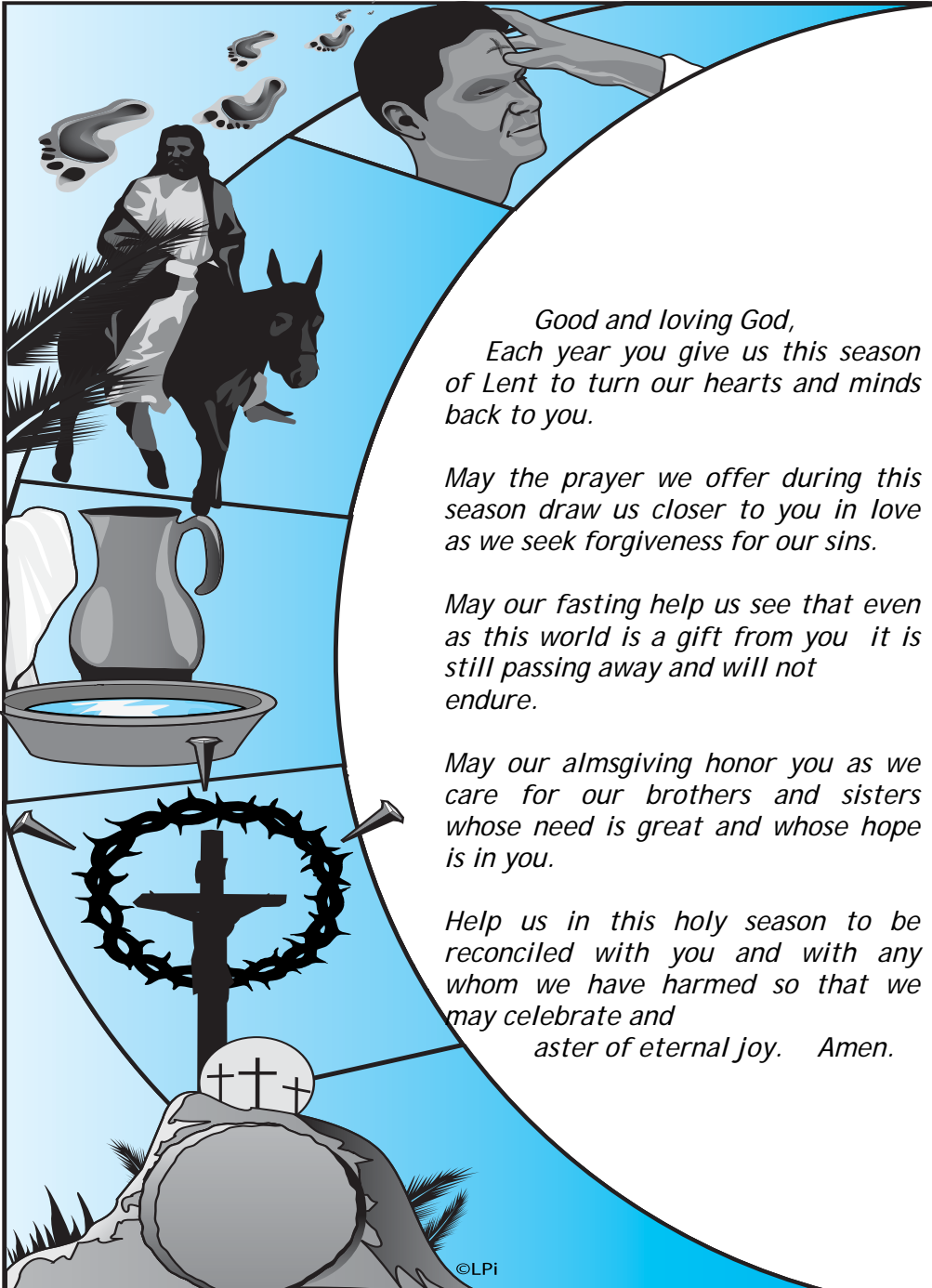

Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the first day of forty days to once again walk with Jesus to Calvary. All of our traditional Lenten devotions and activities, including the Inn of Loaves and Fishes, return along with my Hour of Silent Prayer every Tuesday afternoon. And thanks to the generosity of our Homebound Ministry, a limited number of copies of the Lenten "Little Black Book" will be available this year.

In addition, this Lent St. Therese Parish is honored to welcome a nationally-known speaker, author, and presenter of parish missions and retreats, Father John C. 
Fast and Abstinence

Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent. In addition, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, *i.e.*, eat one full meal and two smaller meals and no other food. The fasting obligation ceases with one's 59th birthday.
